FUN FACTS ABOUT THE COLOR ORANGE

It's the color of traffic cones, autumn leaves, the fruit of the same name, and so much more. You know that nothing rhymes with the word (supposedly), but what else do you know about the shade itself?

- 1. THE COLOR IS NAMED AFTER THE FRUIT**- The first use of "orange" as a color in English dates back to the 15th century, and was derived from pomme d'orange, the French word for the citrus.
- 2. THERE'S SCIENCE BEHIND "SAFETY ORANGE"**- The color first started appearing in technical manuals in the 1950s. In 1959 the Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and Game, along with the U.S. military, studied it as a color for high-visibility gear.
- 3. PLANTS GET THEIR ORANGE HUE FROM CAROTENE**-Bright-orange carrots contain the substance carotene, which gives the vegetable its vibrant hue.
- 4. THERE ARE MULTIPLE REASONS FOR ORANGE FIRE**- The color of the glow from a fire depends on the temperature of the flame. Red fire is cooler in temperature, followed by orange, and then white.
- 5. TIGERS' ORANGE FUR PROVIDES UNLIKELY CAMOUFLAGE**- Tigers hunt a lot of colorblind prey for whom they actually appear to be the same color as the foliage around them.



TURKEY POT PIE

A classic turkey pot pie, made easy using refrigerated pie crust, is the best use for leftover turkey ever to come along. These golden-brown pies are packed with veggies and cooked turkey, all in a lovely, creamy sauce.



Prep Time: 20 mins • Cook Time: 1 hr 5 mins • Total Time: 1 hr 40 mins
Servings: 16 • Yield: 2 pies

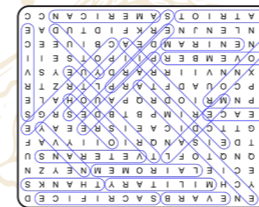
Ingredients		
• 2 cups frozen peas and carrots	• 1 teaspoon salt	• 1 ½ cups milk
• 2 cups frozen green beans	• 1 teaspoon ground black pepper	• 4 cups cubed leftover cooked turkey
• 1 cup sliced celery	• ½ teaspoon celery seed	• 2 (14.1 ounce) packages rolled refrigerated unbaked pie crust
• 2/3 cup butter	• ½ teaspoon onion powder	
• 2/3 cup chopped onion	• ½ teaspoon Italian seasoning	
• 2/3 cup all-purpose flour	• 1 (1 ½ ounce) can chicken broth	

- Directions**
- Place frozen peas, carrots, and beans in a medium saucepan with celery. Add enough water to cover and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium-low and simmer until celery is tender, about 5 minutes. Drain.
 - While the vegetables are simmering, melt butter in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add onion and cook until translucent, about 5 minutes. Add flour, salt, pepper, celery seed, onion powder, and Italian seasoning and whisk until a paste forms, about 1 minute.
 - Slowly whisk in chicken broth and then milk until incorporated. Bring to a simmer and cook, whisking constantly, until sauce thickens, 3 to 5 minutes. Remove thickened sauce from the heat. Add cooked, drained vegetables and cubed turkey and stir until filling is well combined.
 - Set out two 9-inch pie dishes. Fit 1 pie crust round into the bottom of each dish.
 - Spoon half of the pot pie filling into each dish, then lay the remaining piecrust round over top.
 - Pinch and roll the top and bottom crusts together at the edges to seal, cutting off any crust hanging over the edge.
 - Use a sharp knife to cut several small slits in each top crust to allow steam to release while cooking. Place pies on baking sheets. Cover edge of crust with aluminum foil or a pie crust shield.
 - Bake in the preheated oven for 30 minutes. Uncover and continue to bake until the crusts are golden brown and the filling is bubbly, 10 to 15 minutes more. Remove from the oven and cool for 10 minutes before serving.

5 SIGNS YOU NEED NEW TIRES

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), tire failure causes around 11,000 car crashes each year. The NHTSA recommends doing a quick tire inspection once a month to see if you need new tires. Here's what to look for...

- 1. BULGES, GOUGES OR CRACKS** - When a tire deflates, it bulges at the sides. This is a sign of low tire pressure or a slow air leak. If you see cracks in the sidewall, gouges or anything that looks odd, take it to your favorite repair facility and have them look at it.
- 2. TREAD WEAR** - One of the best ways to tell if you need new tires is the old-school penny test: Place a penny into the tread, with Lincoln's head pointing down. If you can still see the top of his noggin, the tread is dangerously low. Most modern tires, however, have wear bars: bits of rubber woven into the pattern at a specific depth. If the tread pattern is worn down to that wear bar, you need to replace the tire.
- 3. TIRE PRESSURE** - Tires deflate at a rate of about one pound per square inch (PSI) per month. You're not going to wear your tires down in a month, but you should check that you have the right inflation pressure regularly.
- 4. TEMPERATURE CHANGES** - Tire pressure drops in extreme cold. The challenge in warmer weather is excessive heat buildup in the tire. If you're heading out on a road trip with an underinflated tire, it will generate more heat and wear out faster.
- 5. VIBRATION** - Watch out for vibration or thumping when you're driving. If it feels like it's coming from under the seats, the rear tires may be out of balance. Vibration from the steering wheel could indicate suspension issues. Anything less than a smooth ride means you should take your car to your local repair shop for a professional inspection.

Lastly, when it's time to replace your tires, do so in pairs or all four at a time for better performance and traction and, ultimately, a safer ride.
