November 26th Happy Thanksgiving!

TRADITIONS MIGHT LOOK A LITTLE DIFFERENT THIS YEAR, BUT YOU CAN STILL CELEBRATE THE HOLIDAY WITH LOVED ONES!

Unsure of how many people to invite to Thanksgiving—or how to host the feast safely during the coronavirus pandemic? You’re not alone. Here are 6 Tips to Host a Safe Thanksgiving During the Coronavirus Pandemic...

1. KNOW THE INFECTION RATES FOR THE COMMUNITIES YOUR GUESTS LIVE IN. Take a look at the coronavirus test positivity rate and current case trends in the county of the host and all potential guests. If rates are climbing rapidly and the positivity rate is high, you should consider a virtual dinner or possibly postponing to a “springsgiving.”

2. CHECK FOR ANY LOCAL RESTRICTIONS OR REGULATIONS FOR GATHERING LIMITS. It’s definitely not worth breaking the law to share a meal. Many states have guidance on the number of people for indoor versus outdoor gatherings based on local data.

3. MEASURE YOUR AVAILABLE SPACE AND INVITE ACCORDINGLY. Examine your private logistics. Measure the space, or the table if you’re planning to share it, and invite only as many people that would allow you to maintain a truly safe distance—at least 6 feet apart.

4. GET CREATIVE WITH YOUR AGENDA, LOCATION, AND SERVING STYLE. An outdoor celebration, or at least some outdoor activities, would be a great option since risk seems to be lower with outdoor gatherings. Being close to others is the highest risk, touching common surfaces is the second highest.

5. ASK EVERYONE TO TAKE PROPER PRECAUTIONS FOR AT LEAST TWO WEEKS BEFORE THANKSGIVING. It would be a good idea for family members to self-isolate as much as possible the weeks before everyone is together. (In case you missed it, yes, it’s A-OK to ask your guests to quarantine before holiday gatherings.)

6. PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE DURING THE CELEBRATION. What mom’s been saying for decades remains true: Wash your hands early and often. Do so for at least 20 seconds with soap and water, and avoid sharing food, drinks, utensils, or other serveware at all times.


DON’T LET YOUR THANKSGIVING ROAD TRIP BE A TURKEY!

One way to ensure you will get to dinner in time for turkey on Thanksgiving is by making sure that the vehicle you’ll be driving is running well. A 10-minute pre-trip check is small potatoes compared to a big helping of inconvenience if you break down many miles away from home, according to the Car Care Council. The Car Care Council suggests the following 10-minute checkup to help ensure vehicle safety & reliability on Thanksgiving, when millions of Americans take to the roads to visit family & friends.

1. Check all fluids, including engine oil, power steering, brake & transmission, as well as windshield washer solvent & antifreeze/coolant.
2. Check the hoses & belts that can become cracked, brittle, frayed, loose or show signs of excessive wear.
3. Check the tires, including tire pressure & tread. Tires should also be checked for bulges & bald spots.
4. Check lighting as the chance of an accident increases if you can’t see or be seen.
5. Check wipers. Make sure the windshield wipers are working properly & keep the reservoir filled with solvent.

The Car Care Council also recommends that motorists restock their emergency kit. To save on fuel costs during the trip, the council suggests that motorists avoid aggressive driving, observe the speed limit & avoid excessive idling.
