### **NOVEMBER IS AVIATION HISTORY MONTH!**

Here's a few fun facts about flying ...

•CO-PILOTS EAT A DIFFERENT MEAL: One rule which is common to the vast majority of commercial airlines is that pilots must be fed the same multi-course meal given to those in first class. Co-pilots are encouraged to eat different entrees to mitigate the risk of all pilots getting food poisoning.

•THE BOEING 747 HAS SIX MILLION PARTS: The Boeing 747 is the most well-known wide-body commercial airliner and cargo transport aircraft in the world. This jumbo jet is recognized as the first huge body aircraft ever manufactured.

•80% OF THE POPULATION HAS A FEAR OF FLYING: The fear of heights is called acrophobia whereas aerophobia is the fear of flying.

•THE WORLD'S BUSIEST COMMERCIAL AIRPORT: The busiest commercial airport in the world is the Hartsfield-Jackson Airport (ATL) in Atlanta. The airport averages over 260,000 passengers every day.

•ONLY 5% OF THE WORLD'S POPULATION HAVE BEEN ON AN AIRPLANE: This one may seem like a shocker, but the number is skewed because many people, especially from underdeveloped regions, have never had the opportunity to fly. At the same time, a small minority of the world's population flies regularly.

•THE WORLD'S MOST FREQUENT FLYER: Chicago resident Tom Stuker, a sales trainer for automobile dealerships around the world, has logged over 1,000,000 miles in a single year, all in first class. Overall, he has traveled over 10 million miles!

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High traffic volumes & unpredictable weather make Thanksgiving a stressful time to travel. According to the AAA, the number of Thanksgiving travelers will top 54 illion, the highest travel volume in over a dozen years. While you can't control the traffic or the weather, you can make sure that your vehicle is prepared for the trip, says the non-profit Car Care Council. To minimize stress & avoid holiday road trip mishaps, the Car Care Council recommends checking the following items as part of a thorough pre-trip vehicle check.

- Check the brake system & make sure the battery connection is clean, tight & corrosion-free.
- Check filters & fluids, including engine oil, power steering & brake & transmission, as well as windshield washer solvent & antifreeze/coolant.
- Make sure heaters, defrosters & wipers work properly. Consider winter wiper blades & use cold weather washer fluid.
- Check the hoses & belts that can become loose, cracked, brittle, frayed or show signs of excessive wear.
- Check the tires, including tire pressure & tread. Tires should also be checked for bulges & bald spots. If snow & ice are a problem in your area, consider specia tires designed to grip slick roads.

 Check that the gas cap is not loose, damaged or missing to prevent gas from spilling or evaporating.

Check to see that exterior & interior lights work & headlights are properly aimed.

"If you're due for a tune-up, have it done before heading out for the holidays in order to improve engine performance & increase fuel economy," says Rich White, **Executive Director, Car Care Council.**

Child Safety & Protection Month was created to raise awareness about the potential dangers that children face each & every day.

Statistics from the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention Child Injury Report are a sobering reminder of the importance of this issue. It found that an estimated 9.2 million children annually had an initial emergency department visit for an unintentional injury. Furthermore, on average, 12,175 children 0 to 19 years of age die each year in the United States from an unintentional & often preventable injury.

• 2 cloves garlic, minced 8 oz. sliced mushrooms 1 lb. green beans, trimmed • 1/4 c. all-purpose flour • 6 tbsp. butter, divided • 3 c. whole milk 1 onion, sliced into half moons • 1 1/2 c. fried onions

Preheat oven to 350°. Prepare an ice bath: In a large pot of boiling water, add green beans and cook bright green, about 6 minutes. With a slotted spoon or tongs, quickly transfer green beans to ice bath

to cool, then drain and transfer to a large bowl. In a large ovenproof skillet over medium heat, melt 2 tablespoons butter. Add onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until tender, about 5 minutes. Add mushrooms and season

with salt and pepper. Cook, stirring often, until mushrooms are golden, about 5 minutes more. Stir in garlic and cook until fragrant, 1 minute, then transfer mixture to green bean bowl. In same skillet over medium heat, melt remaining 4 tablespoons butter. Whisk in flour and cook until golden, about 2 minutes. Gradually whisk in milk and season with salt and pepper. Bring to a simmer and cook until thickened, about 4 minutes. Remove from heat, then add green bean mixture and toss until evenly combined. Bake until warmed through and bubbling, about 30 minutes. Top with fried onions and bake 5 minutes more.
